

A WORD FROM THE CHAIRMAN

In early February 2023, both the State of Illinois and the Federal Government announced that the Covid-19 Public Health Emergency will end on May 11, 2023.

Accordingly, Kankakee County
Administration will transition from
the "KCR3 Response" funding, which
generally focused on replacing lost
revenue for small businesses, notfor-profits, and governmental units
that did not receive ARPA funding,
and into the next Phase; Social
Services grant opportunities.

The Board intends to devote \$2 million to partnerships and unique programming that is designed to address key community issues, avoid competition and redundancy between NFP service providers, and measure the impact which allows the entire community to better focus funding after ARPA funds have been expended in 2026.

The Kankakee County Board hopes that the application of these funds has been beneficial for our community, and we are excited to begin the process of funding results-oriented, data-driven social programming that addresses documented County-wide issues.

UPDATES TO THE LAW

The Overview of the Final Rule by the U.S. Department of the Treasury provides an updated summary of provisions for deployment of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. Overall, the Final Rule delivers greater flexibility for use of funds. The Final Rule went into effect on April 1, 2022

The Final Rule maintains the Interim Final Rule's restriction on ineligible uses of funds such as pensions, legal settlements, rainy day funds or changes that reduce net tax revenue.

Kankakee County was allocated \$21.3 million. The ARPA funding is separated into two funds, the ARPA fund and the Lost Revenue fund.

Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds: Overview of the Final Rule

The following are key updates to the Final Rule:

- Allows counties to use up to \$10 million of ARPA funds as Lost Revenue or calculate Loss Revenue with the Treasury's formula with growth rate increasing from 4.1% to 5.2.%.
- Clarifies eligible uses of funds for capitol projects, broadband infrastructure, and recovery projects.
- Streamlines options for recovering businesses and new businesses started during pandemic.
- Broadens water and sewer projects to include storm water, and culvert repair.
- Authorizes re-hiring of staff and streamlines options for premium pay.
- Presumes certain populations were "impacted" and "disproportionately impacted."

Support Public Health Response

Fund COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff



Replace Public Sector Revenue Loss

Use funds to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic



Water and Sewer Infrastructure

Make necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water and invest in wastewater and stormwater infrastructure



Address Negative Economic Impacts

Respond to economic harms to workers, families, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector



Premium Pay for Essential Workers

Offer additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors



Broadband Infrastructure

Make necessary investments to provide unserved or underserved locations with new or expanded broadband access

KCR3 Policies

In July of 2021, Kankakee County introduced **Kankakee County's Respond, Revitalize and Reinvest (KCR3)** initiative to plan and guide the allocation of ARPA funds in Kankakee County.

The overarching policies adopted by the Kankakee County Board guides the process and deployment of ARPA funds by considering the following:

- As practicable, deploy two years of ARPA funds on initiatives that have a longterm (ten to twenty-year) impact.
- Where applicable, utilize Special/Internal funds before ARPA funds.
- Access grant funds instead of ARPA funds when possible.
- Identify and support communities that were unable/ineligible to participate in the CURES/PPP/CARES programs.
- Build a consensus for regional projects, solicit public involvement and deliver the same exceptional transparency exemplified by all other Kankakee County Administration processes.
- Where applicable, grantees must demonstrate access to operational funding post-ARPA (no county funding).
- Grantees with programs that overlap in terms of geography and/or scopeservice area will be encouraged to <u>partner and coordinate</u>.
- Priority will be given to locally-owned business and employees/students.
- The Kankakee County Board supports initiatives, infrastructure improvements, and grant opportunities that address the effects of the pandemic on the Kankakee County Government. This policy is designed to reduce the future burden upon taxpayers and addresses County infrastructure needs.

Approved Applicants

Kankakee County Board approved and allocated \$2,856,929 in the year of 2022 as of March 7, 2023. Approved applicants completed the application, submitted supporting documentation and demonstrated a negative financial impact due to the COVID-19 pandemic under U.S. Treasury's ARPA requirements.

Approved applicants expressed gratitude for additional help stating even the smaller amounts may have paid a bill.


County Government Operations (CGO)

An estimated total of \$2,092,620 was allocated for County Government Operations. Local offices were equipped with upgrades and new services to better serve the public, as well as critical infrastructure upgrades such as newer Sheriff vehicles for public safety. The photo to the right (outside ballot box) is an example of an upgraded public service in the Kankakee County Clerk's Office. A new Kankakee County Animal Control facility is also in the works. "Lost Revenue" ARPA funding for these upgrades to enhance public services saves the taxpayer local property tax dollars.







2022 Approved Allocations by Fund

Kankakee County Community Needs Assessment

The following are a few highlights from the Kankakee County Community Needs Assessment survey. The survey captured input related to the following five areas of scope.

- Business and Economic Development
- Housing
- Mental Health
- Law Enforcement
- Workforce Development

1,062 community members participated in the month long survey. The following reflects the responses. Education ranked the highest priority with mental health coming in second place, and youth support programs rounding out third.

Kankakee County Social Services Grant Program
